

My Dear Audience,

At the heart of *California Story* is a tale of loyalty - loyalty to one's family, to one's principles and traditions, to oneself. When we waver from that loyalty, compromise our integrity for advancement, we falter.

I've made my career off of trusted relationships with people who have stood by me, fostered my work, buttressed my artistic impulses, found a home in their hearts for me when it wasn't always popular or fashionable to do so. Michael Alvarez has been one such person. We met almost ten years ago while dreaming of this play. It is a bond that has sustained, energized and emboldened us for all of this time. And now here we are - the world premiere of *California Story*.

We wouldn't be here without other folks who dare to dream as boldly as we do. Enter Jessica Hanna, whom I've known since I first moved back to Los Angeles in the height of the last recession, looking for artistic homes for my work. We bonded over a mutual appreciation for the power of the word and the transportative power of live performance.

These folks have been bedrocks to my career, and I am exhilarated that we get to dream together here and now, with you.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE:

California Story is a mythic tale about power, destruction, survival, and ultimately, rebirth.

The narrative centers around individuals fighting to survive in a broken society. As they strive for upward mobility, they must make a significant personal sacrifice, relinquishing something fundamental to their identity or values. The core of the story lies in their eventual confrontation with the profound consequences of these choices.

It is my hope that this tale prompts a deep reflection in audiences, encouraging them to consider

their own life journey. What sacrifices, both conscious and unconscious, have they made to navigate and integrate into the world around them? What aspects of their true selves might have been compromised, lost, or silenced in their pursuit of progress and belonging? *Ultimately, what price are we, as individuals and as a society, truly willing to pay for advancement?*

Through an epically queer fantastical lens, the piece critically examines and reflects upon our present moment. It's remarkable, and perhaps sobering, that over the ten years Roger and I have been envisioning and developing this work, its immediacy, relevance, and necessity have only grown more apparent. It seems that hardly a day passes without headlines that eerily mirror the core themes we explore within *California Story*. This confluence of art and life positions the piece as a powerful call for global healing and a renewed focus on our collective well-being, rather than solely on individual gain.

A pivotal line from Act Two, spoken by the Pio Pico, encapsulates the driving force behind our creative endeavor: "My survival is my resistance." This line not only underscores our drive for bringing this work to life at this particular moment but also highlights the critical and ongoing need for art that actively elevates the voices and perspectives of queer, trans, and BIPOC artists. For us, as creators from these communities, this creative work is not simply a choice; it is a fundamental necessity, a powerful declaration that we will not be silenced, marginalized, or forgotten in the narratives that shape our world.

Aphrodite Armstrong (Legendary Child #3) is an actress, writer, and comedian based in Los Angeles. She stars in the upcoming mob thriller Ponyboi (dir. Esteban Arango), which premiered at the 2024 Sundance Film Festival in the U.S. Dramatic Competition. She received the 2022 SXSW Special Jury Prize for Outstanding Performances for West by God (dir. Scott Lazer), which premiered at Berlinale. Her debut play Superfake was read at Company of Angels and will be presented at WOW Café Theatre in New York this fall. Roger Q. Mason (Playwright) (they/them) is an award-winning writer, performer and educator who satirizes and revises history to disrupt the biases that separate rather than unite us. Their playwriting has appeared on Broadway; Off/Off-Broadway; and regionally. Their recent productions have garnered five Barrymore Award nominations in Philadelphia, a Jeff Award Recommendation in Chicago and the San Francisco Chronicle's prestigious Datebook Pick. Mason's World Premiere of Lavender Men was lauded by the Los Angeles Times as "evoking the mingled visions of Suzan-Lori Parks, Jeremy O. Harris and Michael R. Jackson." They received 2024's Playwrights' Center McKnight National Playwright Commission, the inaugural Dramatists Guild Foundation Catalyst Grant Award, a Hermitage Residency, a Lucille Lortel commission, a Kilroys List nod, and the Chuck Rowland Pioneer Award. Mason is a member of the Dramatists Guild of America, and an alum of the Ma-Yi's Writing Lab, Page 73's Interstate 73 Writers Group, the Fire This Time Festival, and Primary Stages Writing Cohort. They currently produce a memoir/cooking segment on Instagram called Cooking with Q: A Playwright's Guide to Telling My Truth.
